# Coconut Shell Painting

The students were taught about reducing their plastic use, and making alternatives out of sustainable materials. For this project, coconut shells were smoothed, and then painted to make bright pen holders.



## Planting of seeds

Instead of clay potted plants, coconut shells were used as plant holders.

The children chose their seeds and planted them in the shell they chose.

Each student now has their own plant to look after and tend to.

The youngest students; by painting half of the picture and then folding it over itself, achieved the final picture through symmetry.



# Tiaras

The students enjoyed creating tiaras using brightly coloured paper. After the tiaras were made, they enthusiastically showed off their headgear.





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## Handmade Baskets

The children were taught how to weave baskets out of newspaper, an easily available material. Then they painted their baskets with the colours of their choice.

Introduction to Origami - The students were taught the basics of making forms out of paper.

The importance of Hygiene - The students were also taught the importance of hand washing and keeping your surroundings clean. Videos emphasising the same were also shown to them.
